



BIID INTERIOR DESIGN AWARDS 2022 TERMS AND CONDITIONS

28 January 2022



Introduction:

1. The BIID Interior Design Awards ('the Awards') is owned and operated by the British Institute of Interior Design ('the BIID'). The BIID is a company registered in England & Wales, company registration number 00860708. Its registered office is Summit House, 170 Finchley Rd, London NW3 6BP. Its address for correspondence is 9 Bonhill Street, London EC2A 4PE.

The Awards:

2. Awards will be given for 8 regional categories:

- a. Scotland
- b. North and North West
- c. Wales and Northern Ireland
- d. Midlands and East Anglia
- e. Central London
- f. Greater London
- g. South East
- h. South West

3. The categories are based on postcodes. A full list of postcodes and their associated regional categories is available on the BIID's online platform. A project should be entered based on the postcode of the completed project, not the postcode of the design practice entering it.

4. All entries made in each regional category will also automatically be entered for consideration for 2 additional Awards categories – Interior Design of the Year and the Anna Whitehead Prize for Sustainability.

5. A total of 8 regional Awards will be given out (one for each of the regions mentioned above), in addition to an Award for the Interior Design of the Year and the Anna Whitehead Prize for Sustainability. In addition, if the judges decide that a project is particularly worthy of commendation, despite not being given one of the 10 Awards described above, it may be given a Highly Commended designation.

6. Each of the 10 main Award winners will be given a custom made Award trophy. If there are any Highly Commended projects, they will be awarded a certificate. All Award winners and those given a Highly Commended designation will be publicised on the BIID website and communication channels, in addition to a press release being issued. In addition, all Award winners and those given a Highly Commended designation will be provided with a unique Awards logo which may be used for publicity purposes.



Eligibility to Enter:

7. Any design and/or architecture practice, whether based in the UK or elsewhere, may enter the Awards.
8. An individual who is an assessor or a judge for the Awards (see below) may not submit an entry for the Awards on behalf of their practice. Otherwise, any individual who is an owner or employee of a design and/or architecture practice can enter their practice for the Awards. The BIID will be entitled to assume that the individual entering a practice for the Awards is authorised to do so.
9. An entry for the Awards must relate to a specific interior design project carried out by the practice that is entering ('the Entrant'). To qualify for entry, the interior to which the project relates must be located in the UK and implementation of the project must have been completed between 1st January 2020 and 31st December 2021. Only projects in respect of which implementation was completed during that period may be entered. Unfinished or unrealised projects are not eligible. An Entrant may submit several entries, each relating to a different qualifying project.
10. All Entrants must secure the consent of the client who commissioned the project to have their project entered in the Awards. The BIID reserves the right to ask for proof of such consent.
11. Entrants are required to provide information about their design practice. They must also provide information about size and location of the project(s) entered, and the design process, and provide images, photographs and technical drawings from the project(s). Entrants are able to save, edit and revise their entry application before they submit it.
12. Entries will open at 12.00pm GMT on 7th February 2022 and close at 12.00am GMT on 4th April 2022. The BIID reserves the right in its discretion to extend the closing date. If it does so, it may impose an increased entry fee for entries submitted after the original closing date and time.
13. All entries must be completed and the entry fee paid in full by the entry deadline in order to be considered.
14. All entries must be made and completed exclusively via our online platform at <https://biidawards.awardsplatform.com/>
15. The fee, for each project entered, is £125 for BIID members and £250 for non-members (excluding VAT), subject to paragraph 12 above. The late entry fee is £175 for BIID members and £300 for non-members (excluding VAT). All payments must be made via credit or debit card. The BIID is unable to accept payments via bank transfer, cheque, cash or any other method.
16. By submitting an entry and paying the entry fee the Entrant is fully and unreservedly agreeing to these Terms and Conditions.
17. The BIID reserves the right to disqualify an entry if, after an investigation, it appears that the entry contained inaccurate or misleading information or the Entrant has in the opinion of the BIID (acting reasonably) behaved in a manner contrary to the rules or the spirit of the Awards. If the BIID disqualifies any entry, it may also disqualify other entries made by or on behalf of the same Entrant.

Assessors and Judges:

19. The BIID will appoint a panel of expert assessors to visit projects and a panel of 10 appropriately qualified judges to conduct the final judging.
20. All assessors and judges will be required to declare any conflicts of interest and recuse themselves from assessing or judging particular projects if there is a conflict.
21. The names and biographies of the judges will be published on the BIID website.

Judging Process:

22. The judging process will take place in three phases:
 - a. Shortlisting: All entered projects will be reviewed online, scored according to the same criteria, and the top scoring projects will be shortlisted.
 - b. In person visits: All shortlisted projects will be visited in person by an assessor (see below).
 - c. Final judging: Once all shortlisted projects have been visited by an assessor, the final judging will take place where the winners of each category will be determined.
23. In addition to determining the winning projects for each of the 8 regional categories, Interior Design of the Year, and Anna Whitehead Prize (see above), the judges may also recognise projects that deserve to be noted as Highly Commended.

In Person Visits:

24. Assessor visits to shortlisted projects will be conducted between Tuesday 3rd May and Thursday 30th June 2022. It is anticipated that each visit duration will be between 30 minutes and 2 hours, depending on the size of the project. A representative from the Entrant design practice must be in attendance on site during the visit. The BIID will endeavour to agree a date and time that is convenient for both the Entrant's representative and the owner of the relevant premises, or their authorised representative.
25. If the BIID is not able to arrange an in person visit to a shortlisted project in accordance with the requirements described above, the project will be withdrawn from consideration for the Awards. The BIID will inform the Entrant accordingly.



Awards Ceremony:

26. The Awards will be presented at a ceremony in central London on 5th October 2022.
27. Tickets for the Awards ceremony must be purchased separately. Entry to the Awards does not guarantee a place at the Awards ceremony.

Judges' Decisions Final:

28. The judges' decisions are final and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into.
29. Nor, unfortunately, will the BIID be able to give feedback to unsuccessful Entrants.

Publicity and Intellectual Property:

30. The shortlisted projects will be announced in the week commencing 2nd May 2022.
31. The BIID must either publish or make available information that indicates that valid awards took place. To comply with this requirement, the BIID will publish details about all the winning projects on its website on or around 6th October 2022.
32. By entering a project for the Awards, the Entrant grants permission for the BIID to use the project summary and final project photographs supplied in the entry on its website, on social media, in the BIID newsletter and in other communication channels used by the BIID. In addition, the Entrant agrees to the BIID sharing the text and photographs supplied with other selected organisations/individuals, such as media organisations, for the purposes of promoting the Awards.
33. Each Entrant represents and warrants that it has the right to permit use of the project summary and final project photographs as above, and that such use will not infringe the copyright or other rights of any third party.

Data Protection:

34. All personal data collected by the BIID in connection with the Awards will be processed in accordance with the [BIID Privacy Policy](#) which is viewable on the BIID's website.
35. The address of any private residence that is entered for the Awards for the purposes of arranging an in person assessor visit will be kept in the strictest confidence and will only be shared as necessary for conduct of the Awards including, for example, to arrange assessor visits.



Other Terms:

36. The BIID does not accept responsibility for Awards entries that are lost, mislaid, or not validly and completely submitted, regardless of cause, including, for example, as a result of any equipment failure, technical malfunction, communications systems failure, or computer hardware or software failure of any kind.
37. The BIID reserves the right to hold void, suspend, cancel, or amend the Awards and to amend these terms and conditions at any time.
38. These terms and conditions shall be governed by English law, and the Entrant and the BIID submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of England and Wales.
